ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students must meet the Academic and English entry requirement for the chosen course to gain entry to Brighton College. Please Note: Brighton College does not enrol students under 18 years of age.

ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For Certificate III and IV Qualifications

- Satisfactory completion of at least an Australian year 11 or equivalent

For Diploma and Advanced Diploma Qualifications

- Satisfactory completion of at least an Australian year 12 or equivalent

For Post Graduate Qualifications

- Satisfactory completion of Australian AQF Level 5 or higher (for International Students who do not have Australian qualification – satisfactory completion of a three (3) year bachelor's degree).

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

For Certificate IV, Diploma and Advanced Diploma Qualifications

- IELTS Academic Test Score of 5.5 or equivalent (test results must be no more than 2 years old).

For Post Graduate Qualifications

- IELTS Academic Test Score of 6.0 or equivalent (test results must be no more than 2 years old).

International Students may not be required to provide evidence of English Language competence where documented evidence can be provided to demonstrate any of the following:

- The student was educated for 5 years in an English speaking country.
- The student has completed at least 6 months of a Certificate IV level course in an Australian RTO.
- The student has successfully completed an English Placement Test.
- The student has successfully completed a foundation course in Australia.
- The student has successfully completed their High School in the English Language.





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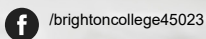

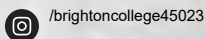

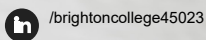
